ACCREDITATION REVIEWS

Reviews take place over two to three days and are undertaken by a team of reviewers who have been trained by Accreditation Advisers.

A range of activities may be undertaken during the review including:

- observations of practice
- discussions with staff from the service
- review of documentation
- meetings with autistic individuals
- summarising findings into a review report.
