Based on the outskirts of Godalming, this detached home is well positioned for wonderful local walks in the Surrey countryside whilst only being a 15 minute walk from the town centre.

Autism and associated learning disabilities.

Adults - Supported living service (3 adults)

Number of people living in the service: 2

1 placement within the house

Age range of people in the service: 30-50 years old

Staffing ratio and provided care

We provide 24 hour support and a staff member ratio of 1:2 or 1:1 and 2:1 for certain activities.

Our staff undertake a comprehensive induction. This includes specific autism training, positive behaviour support, communication, and they engage in ongoing continuing professional development as required.

Staff are there to provide effective support around different aspects of living with others and life skill development to ensure they are happy, safe and secure in their own home.

We provide support to maintain healthy lifestyles, medication and personal care, as well as overall support to develop health action plans.



Service facilities

The house consists of a large kitchen diner, lounge and balcony with seating.

There are three single bedrooms and an additional sleep in room for support staff. There is a toilet, bathroom with toilet bath and separate shower and a large front and rear garden.

The accommodation is set over one floor.

Community facilities

Godalming town centre is a 15 minute walk away and there is a bus stop near the house so transport links are good to travel further afield.

Train and motorway links are great for trips to the coast or into London. Keen walkers have access to a range of walking routes nearby.

People living here are able to enjoy fun and social leisure activities, holidays, cultural and religious interests.
