Hoylands House

Hoylands House is situated in Silkstone, in the foothills of the Pennines, between the towns of Barnsley and Penistone.

Hoylands House also offers flexible respite provision for 1 person per night in a separate part of the building.

Care categories:

Autism and associated learning disabilities.

Adults - Residential (8 people)

Number of people living in the service: 7

1 en-suite room (sharing with 5 gentlemen and 2 women)

Staffing ratio and provided care

We provide 24 hour support and a staff member ratio of 1:2 or 1:1 and 2:1 for certain activities.

Our staff undertake a comprehensive autism induction including positive behaviour support and communication and provide a low arousal environment.

Our Garden Creations Shop at Hoylands House is a social enterprise service that enables young autistic people to feel empowered undertaking real work and to develop new skills.

We make crafts such as soaps, candles and cards to sell in our shop. The people we support have the opportunity to gain ASDAN qualifications under the tutorial of our Enterprise Senior Support Worker.



Service facilities

The house has extensive grounds and a large secluded back garden with picnic areas, woodland seating, hammock, swings and a tennis court. There is also a hot tub and a summer house.

The house has various communal areas, which include a large kitchen, two dining rooms, three very spacious lounges, an arts and crafts lounge and a small sensory room with an interactive sensory mat.

Community facilities

The property is within walking distance to shops and amenities and there is a regular bus route and rail links.

We have a qualified Aromatherapist visiting once a week and use of an offsite private swimming pool for young people who find crowds difficult.

People living here are able to access a range of enjoyable activities linked to their interests within the local community.

“We have guinea pigs and rabbits which we encourage the people we support to groom, pet and tend to. By having chickens we can incorporate feeding, watering and egg collection into daily programmes.”

- Be over 16 years of age
- Have appropriate funding
